2,012 miles in 2012: A bicycle ride of compassion for the children of South Asia

Each year, three million children die from malnutrition and disease (unicef). That's one child dying every 10 seconds.

There are people who care about this fact and people who don't. And then there are people who care A LOT. People who want to do something about it. People who decide to go the extra mile—literally.

People like David and Sharon Argabright. On March 26th, they started on a bike ride. But not just any bike ride—a bicycle ride of compassion, traveling 2,012 miles from Nashville, TN, to Key West, FL. And it's not their first ride: for the fourth year in a row, David Argabright, supported by his wife in an SAG vehicle, is going "the extra mile". Starting with a 575 mile ride in 2009 and 820 miles in 2010, he rode all the way from San Diego, CA, to St. Augustine, FL, in 2011: 3,100 miles of compassion.

In this monumental effort David & Sharon are supported by family, friends and partners all over the world who are giving generously towards the establishment of child development centers (CDCs) in Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Nepal. Thousands of dollars have been raised so far to sponsor a total number of 27 CDCs for two years. In CDCs, underprivileged children, who would usually have little chance of a hopeful future or even survival, receive an education, health care and nutrition, spiritual and social training and emotional support.
